April 18, 2022 – 0906 hours

An open door was reported at a residence on Sugar Run Trail. Officers checked the home and contacted the resident. The door was resecured.

April 18, 2022 – 1612 hours

Officers were dispatched to Creekview Place for a welfare check after Darke County Deputies received a hang-up call from a phone number at that residence. All residents checked OK and it was determined the call was made by a juvenile who dialed the wrong number.

April 19, 2022 – 1238 hours

A disturbance was reported on Wentworth Village Drive. Officers stood by to assist with an unruly juvenile until parents arrived.

April 19, 2022 – 1506 hours

A soliciting complaint was reported on Rosecrest Drive. Officers located the subjects and informed them they needed a valid solicitors permit.

April 19, 2022 – 2335 hours

While on patrol, an officer observed a suspicious vehicle on S. East Street. Officers located a subject sleeping in the vehicle. He left the area without incident.

April 20, 2022 – 0345 hours

A domestic dispute was reported on Weller Lane. After further investigation, Officers determined that the dispute was physical. One individual was placed under arrest and transported to the Greene County Jail.

April 20, 2022 – 1625 hours

Officers were dispatched to W. Franklin Street to assist with a vehicle lockout. Entry was gained prior to officers' arrival.



April 22, 2022 – 0209 hours

While on patrol, officers located an unsecured door on N. Linda Drive. Officers checked the building and secured the door.

April 22, 2022 – 0615 hours

While on patrol, officers observed a subject believed to be scrapping removing items from trash on Kensington Drive. The subject was given a verbal warning for scrapping and left the area without incident.

April 22, 2022 – 1530 hours

Officers were dispatched to a business on State Route 725 for a property damage complaint. A large work truck damaged the overhang and left the scene. The investigation is ongoing.

April 22, 2022 – 1540 hours

Officers responded to Sugar Run Trail for a traffic crash with injuries involving a vehicle and a bicycle. The bicycle rider was taken to the hospital with minor injuries. The vehicle left the scene prior to officers' arrival. The investigation is ongoing.

April 22, 2022 – 2144 hours

A loose emu was reported on S. Main Street. Officers and the birds owners were able to safely catch the bird and return it to the Sugarcreek Bird Farm.

April 22, 2022 – 2301 hours

Officers conducted a traffic stop on W. Franklin Street after observing the driver squealing their tires and driving recklessly. Further investigation revealed that the driver was intoxicated. The driver was charged with OVI.



April 23, 2022 – 0021 hours

Officers responded to a business on State Route 725 for intoxicated individuals refusing to leave the business. Officers located the individuals and stood by until drivers arrived to transport them home.

April 23, 2022 – 1345 hours

Officers took a damaging complaint on Garry Drive. It is believed a small rock from a lawnmower may have caused damage to a window.

April 23, 2022 – 2120 hours

Disorderly conduct was reported on East Walnut Street after a subject urinated in the park and shoved another festival patron to the ground. Officers located the subject and he was charged with disorderly conduct and released to a responsible party.
