July 3, 2022 – 0440 hours

Officers responded with the medics to Brewsters Run Court on a medical alarm drop. One subject was taken to MVS for evaluation.

July 3, 2022 – 2050 hours

A found dog was reported on Washington Mill Rd. Due to the shelter being closed, officers were unable to take possession of the dog. The RP agreed to keep the dog until the shelter reopened.

July 4, 2022 – 0027 hours

A possible domestic disturbance was reported on W. Maple Street. The caller could hear people arguing loudly. Officers located the subjects and determined the dispute was verbal only and no threats were made.

July 4, 2022 – 1220 hours

Officers were dispatched to W. Maple Street on an animal complaint. The complainant stated that a dog broke loose from its yard and charged at his dog. Officers located the owner of the loose dog and issued a written warning for dog at large. No injuries reported.

Officers conducted a traffic stop on W. Franklin St. After detecting an odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle, officers searched the vehicle and found marijuana and a substance believed to be cocaine. The driver was cited, and the drugs were confiscated. Charges are pending.

July 5, 2022 – 2302 hours

A suspicious vehicle was reported on Glenberry Court. Officers searched the area, but the vehicle was GOA.

July 6, 2022 – 1142 hours

Officers were dispatched to S. Main Street on a criminal damaging complaint. Known subjects damaged the homeowners HVAC system and cut wires. The investigation is ongoing.

Officers met with a resident on Post regarding a past occurred auto theft. A known subject took the complainants vehicle from Sugar Run Trail without their consent. Officers began an investigation, and the vehicle was later returned. No charges filed.
