**September 11, 2022 – 1141 hours**

Officers were dispatched to a harassment complaint on S. Lakeman Drive. Unknown subjects were harassing the complainant over social media apps.

**September 12, 2022 – 1228 hours**

A welfare check was requested on an individual found sleeping in a vehicle that did not belong to him. Officers located the individual and determined that he was under the influence of alcohol. Medics were called and the individual was transported to MVS for further evaluation. Officers also located a firearm on the subject. He was later charged with disorderly conduct – public intoxication and possessing firearms while intoxicated.

**September 12, 2022 – 1237 hours**

Officers spoke with a resident on Post regarding a fraud complaint. Unknown subjects fraudulently gained access to the complainant's driver's license and personal information.

**September 12, 2022 – 1847 hours**

Officers conducted a traffic stop on State Route 725 for speed. Further investigation led to the driver being cited for DUS. The driver also had an active Bellbrook warrant and was later transported to the Greene County Jail without incident.

**September 13, 2022 – 1206 hours**

A Peace Officer standby was requested on S. Main Street.

**September 14, 2022 – 0239 hours**

While on patrol, officers noticed a suspicious vehicle on Marcia Drive. Officers made contact with the driver, who stated she was waiting on a friend. No cause for complaint.

**September 14, 2022 – 1858 hours**

An iPad was found on W. Franklin Street. The owner was located, and the property was returned.



**September 15, 2022 – 2036 hours**

Officers conducted a traffic stop on Possum Run Road after the driver failed to yield to another vehicle. Further investigation led to the driver being cited for DUS and Failure to Yield.

**September 16, 2022 – 0157 hours**

A 9-1-1 hang-up was reported on Kensington Drive. After speaking to all residents, it was determined this was due to a child accidentally dialing 9-1-1.

**September 16, 2022 – 0817 hours**

Officers responded to a parking complaint on W. Maple Street. The complainant stated that construction equipment was blocking the alley. Officers located the owner, and the equipment was moved without incident.

**September 17, 2022 – 1115 hours**

Officers were dispatched to a traffic crash on W. Franklin Street. No injuries were reported, and one driver was cited for ACDA.

A welfare check was requested on Ryder Court due to a verbal argument. All parties checked OK, and it was determined that the argument was verbal only and no threats had been made.
