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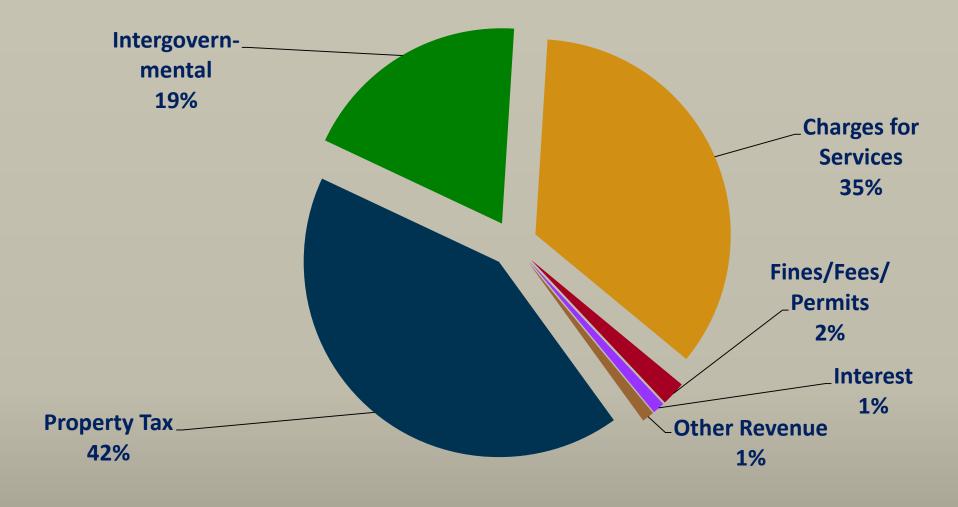

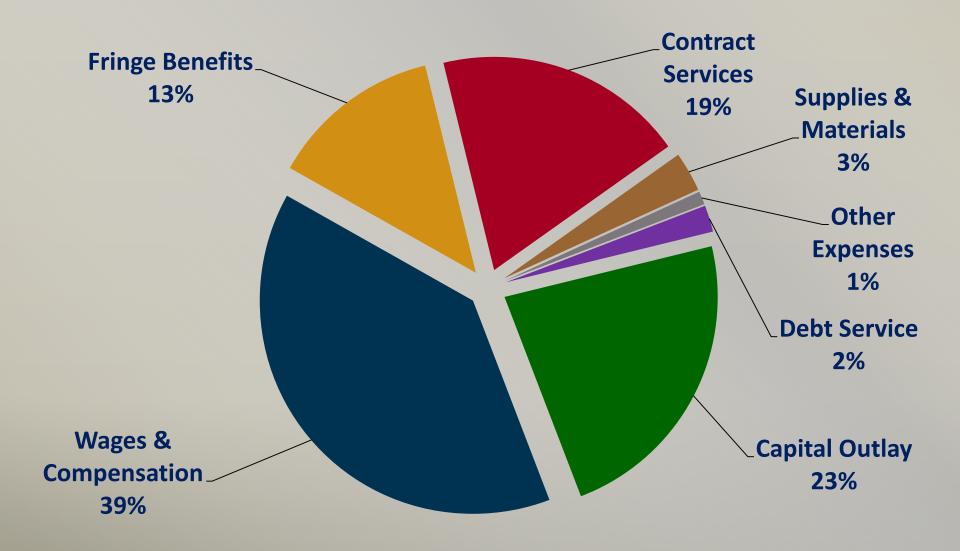

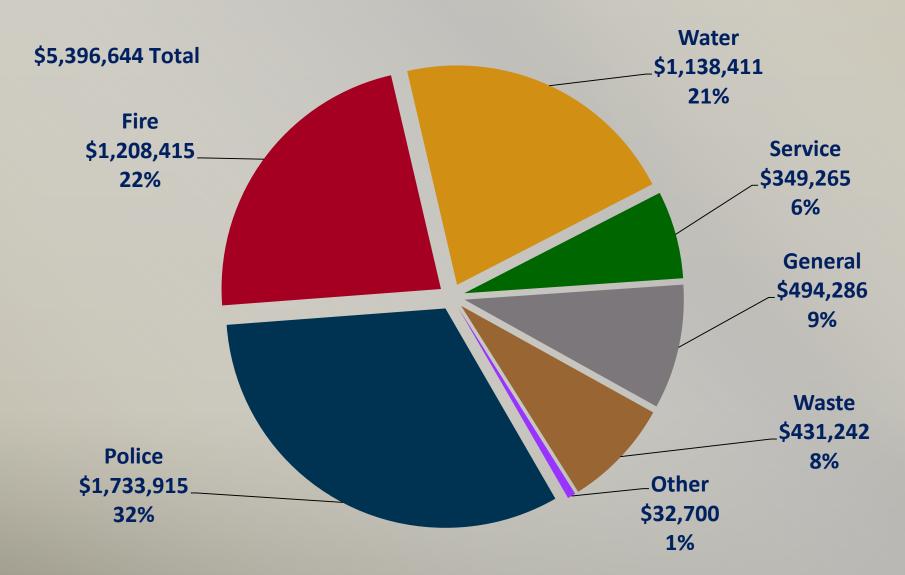
2017 Budget Breakdown

\$7,186,230 (excluding transfers)





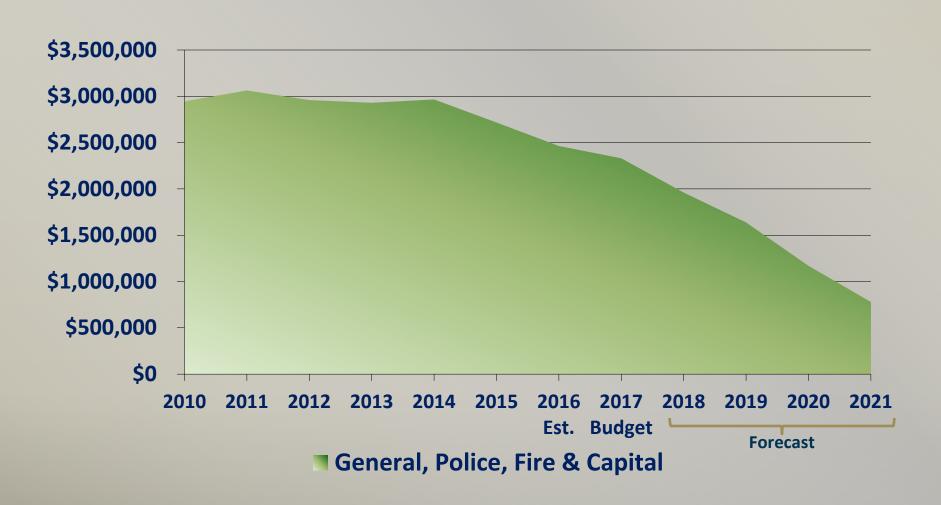
2017 Operating Expenses by Function





Year End Fund Balance

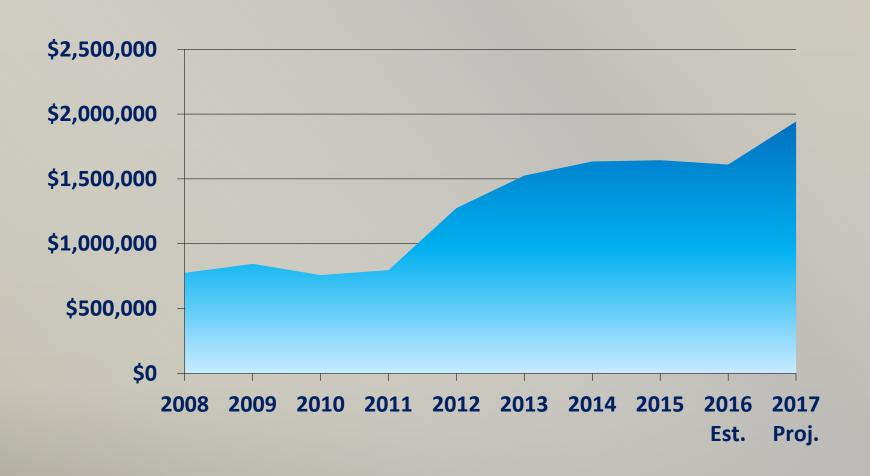
