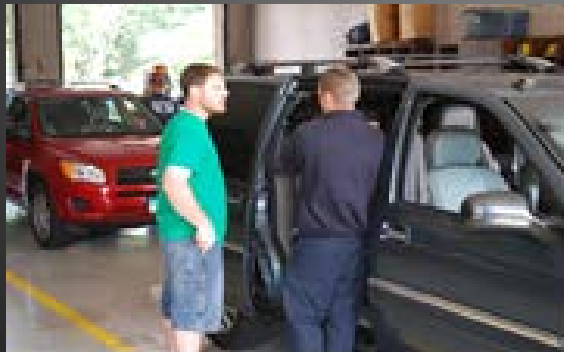

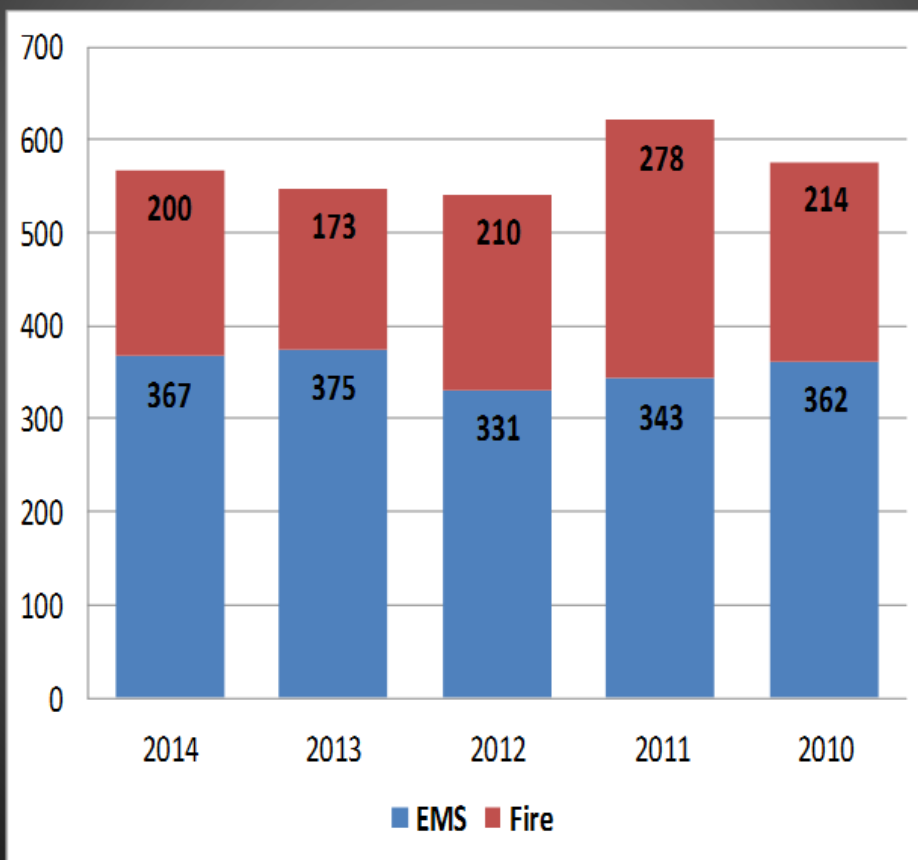

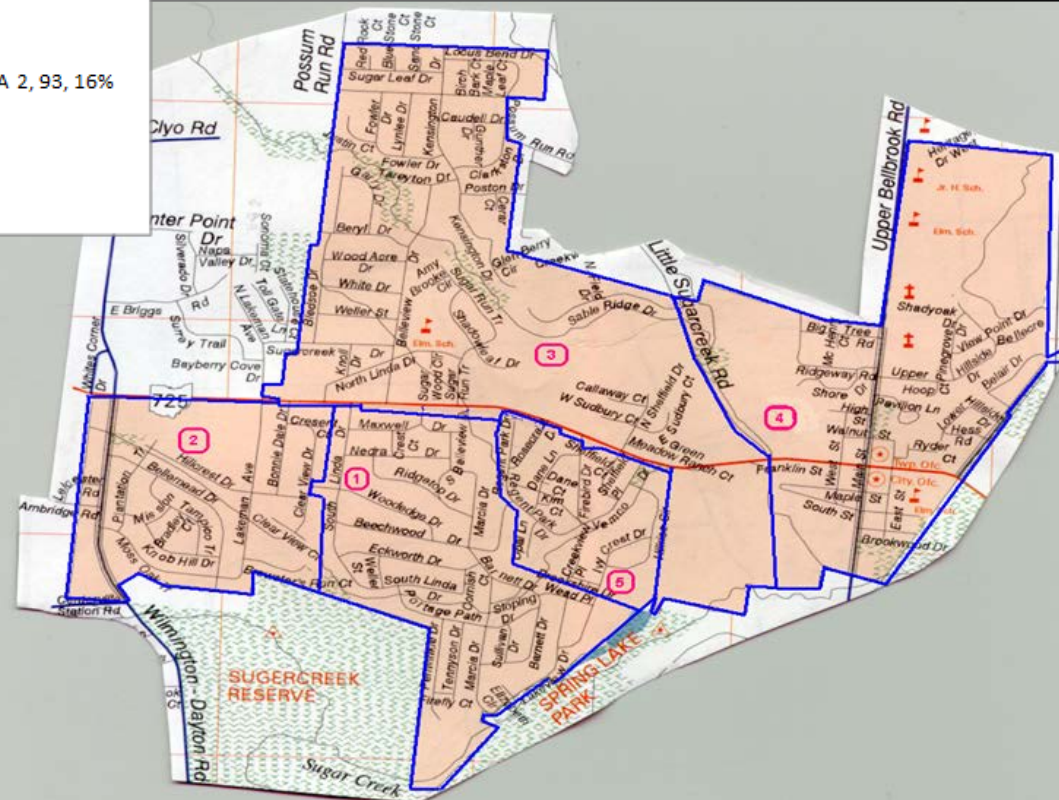
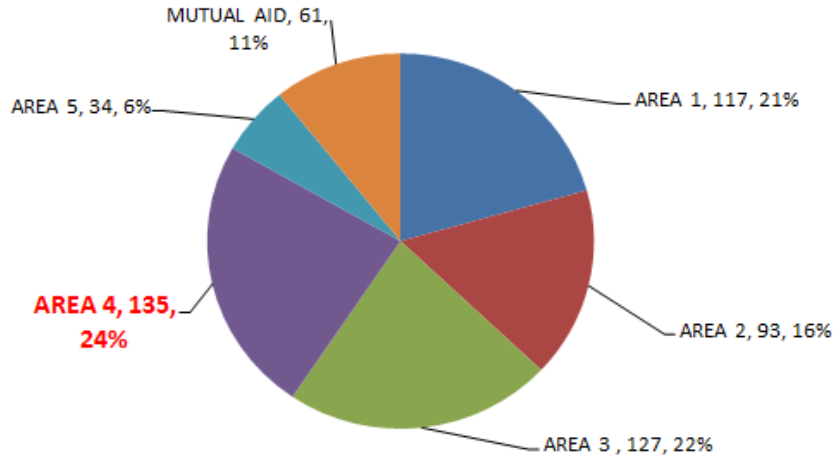
- 5 Year Run Comparison

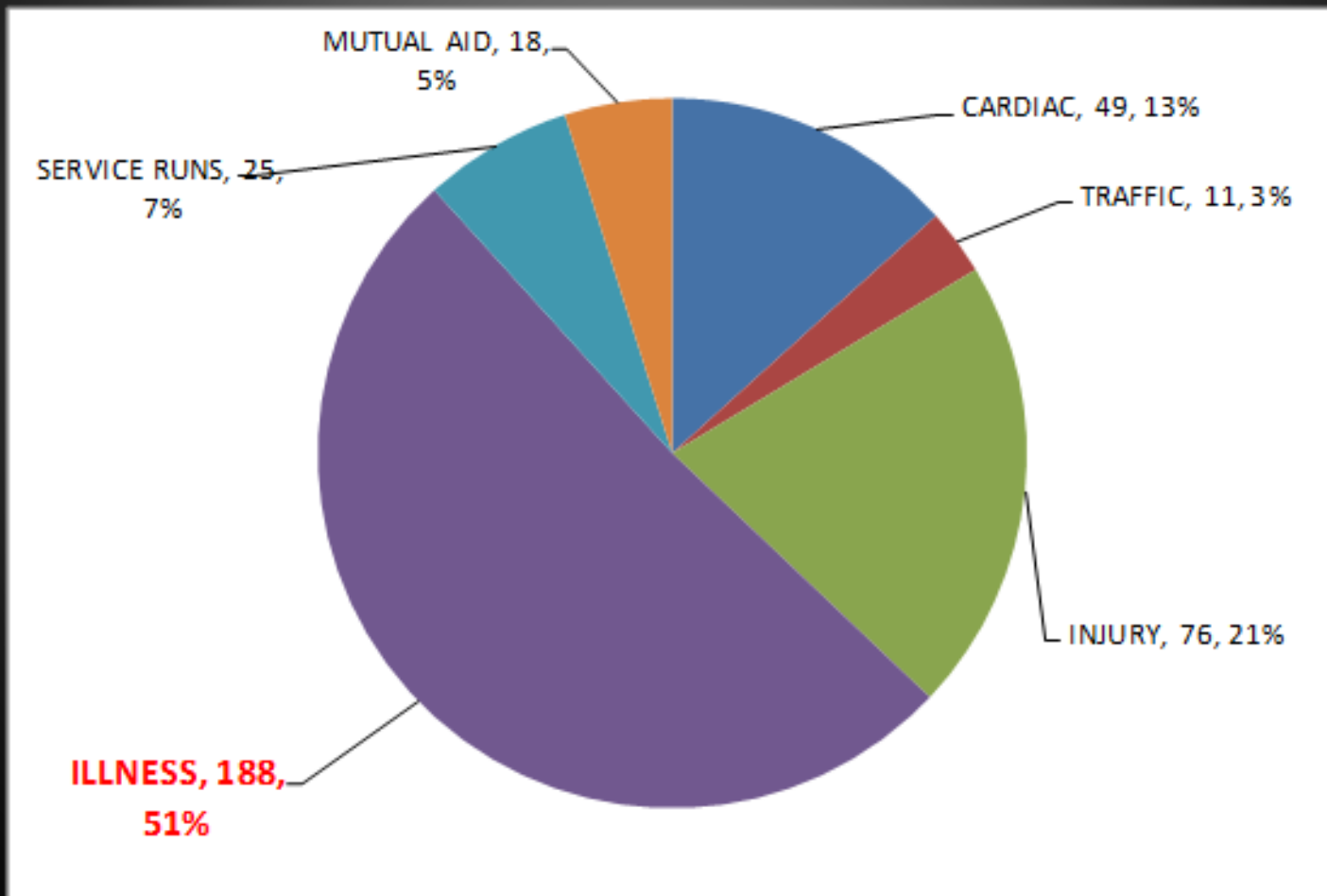
- Runs By Area

2014 Run Analysis/Area



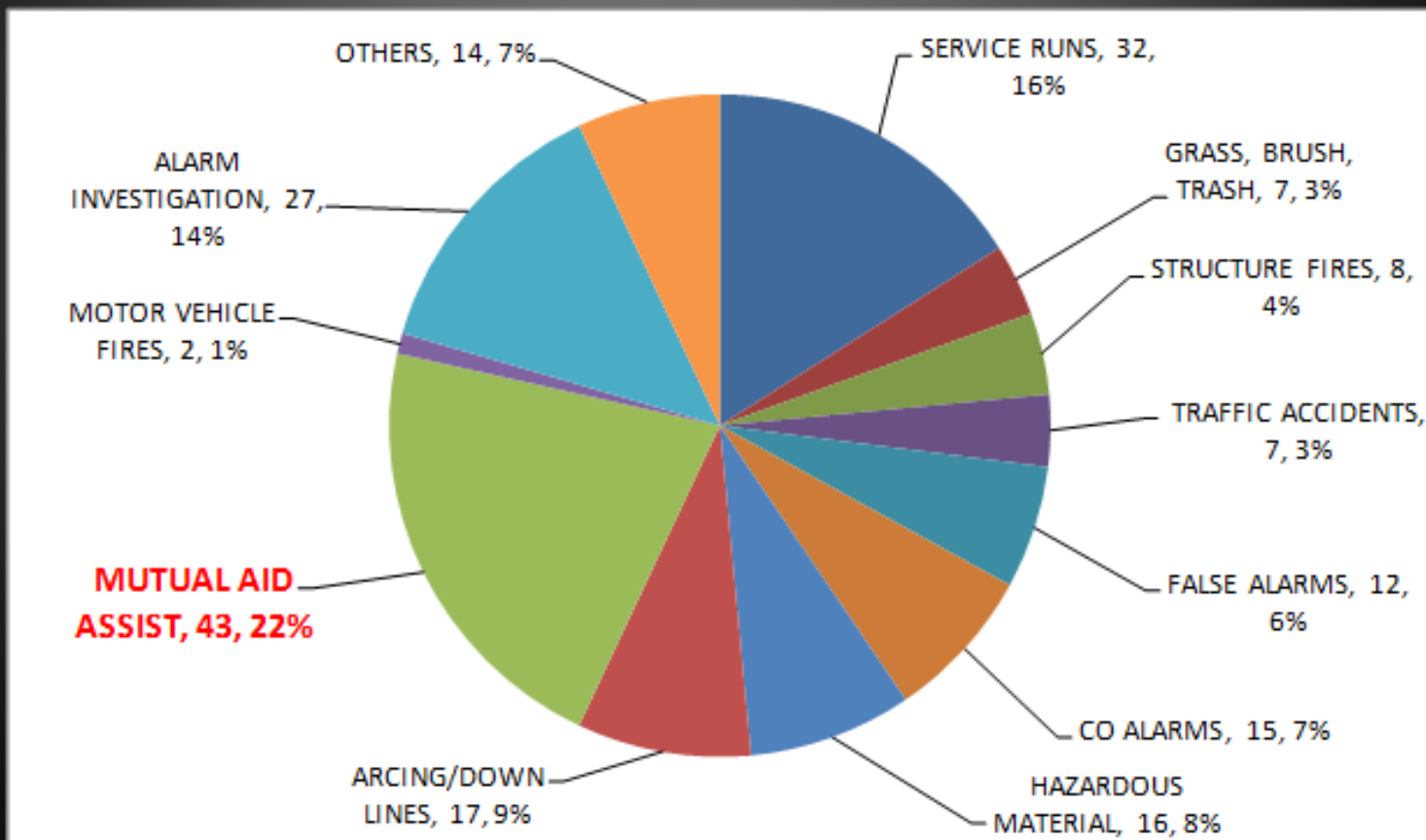

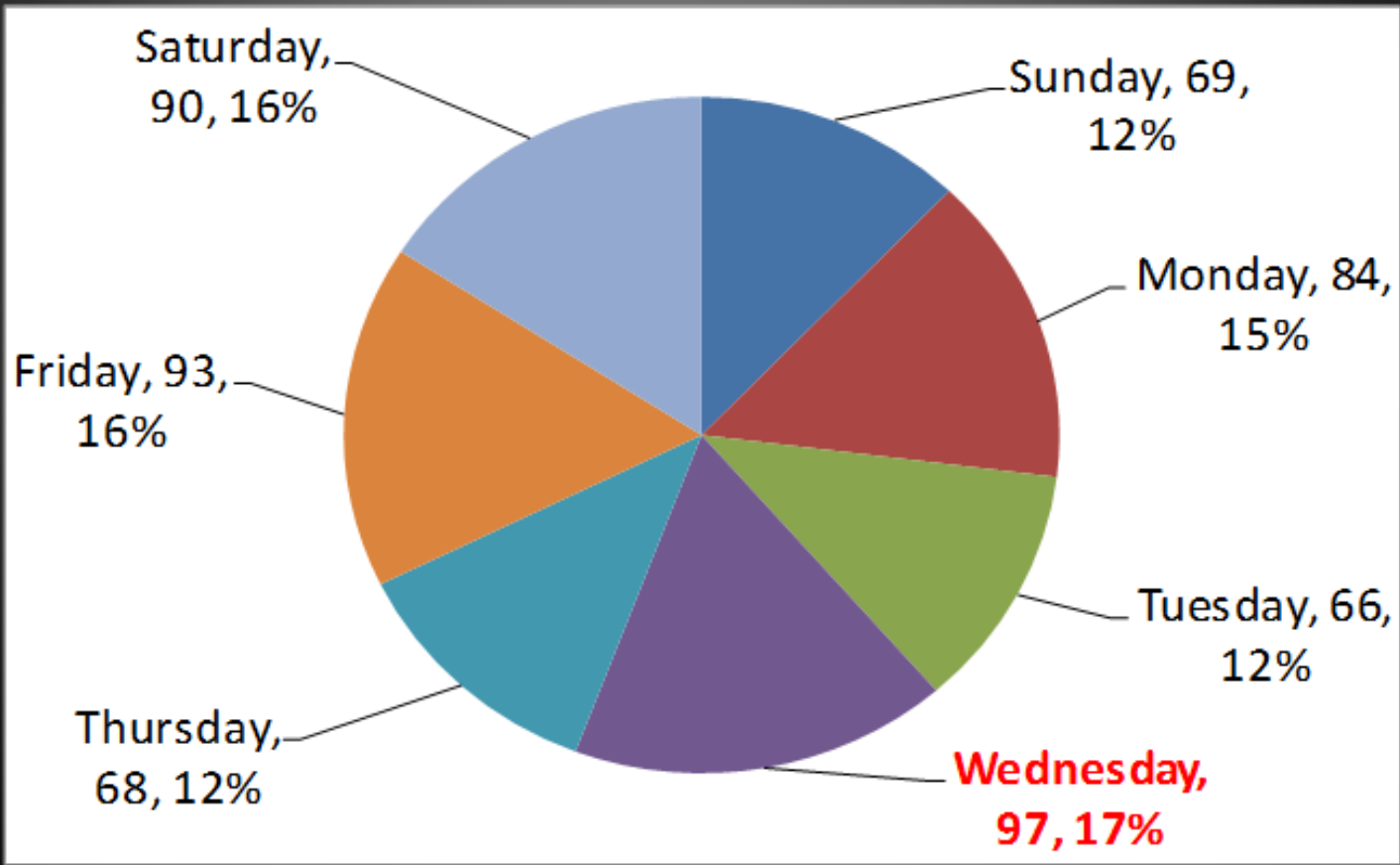

- Fire Incidents



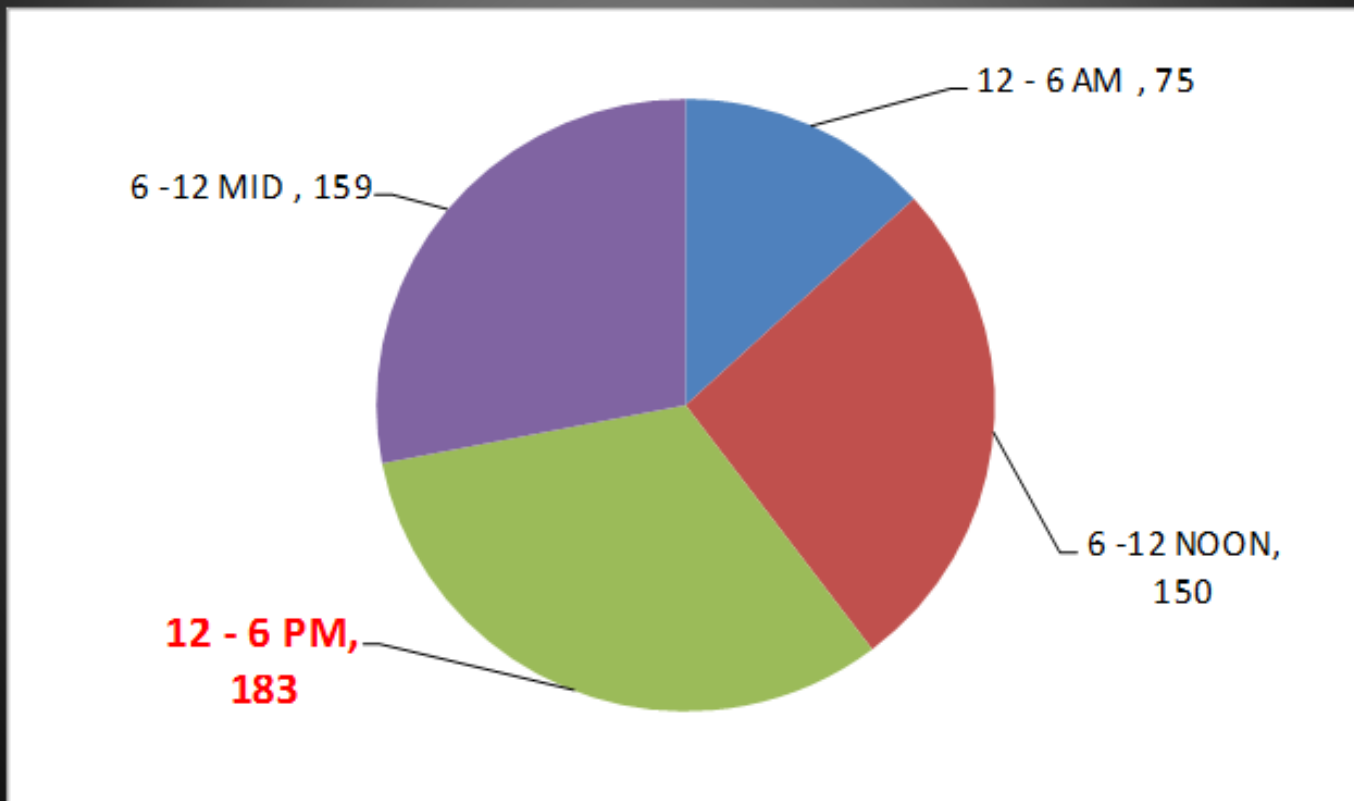
