Year in Review 2016

Traffic Enforcement

- ▶ Warrant Arrests: +80% (from 2015)
 - ▶ DUS Arrests: +121%
 - ▶ Citations Issued: +17%
 - ▶ Warnings Given: 1,448 total
 - ▶ OVI Arrests: 58 total – up 14%
-
- ▶ DUS and Warrant arrest totals are up markedly due to availability of information provided to the Officers via in-car computers/MDTs.

Overall Activity

- ▶ Overall activity is up 5% from 2015 levels.
- ▶ BPD has investigated 182 more calls for service than in 2015

Supervisory Training

- ▶ Lt. Steve Carmin attended leadership training in Buffalo, NY, which was hosted by the FBI.
 - *This training is designed to give command staff officers the ability to learn leadership techniques while networking with fellow command officers from a surrounding three-state area.*
- ▶ We will send our two Sergeants to this training in 2017 and 2018.

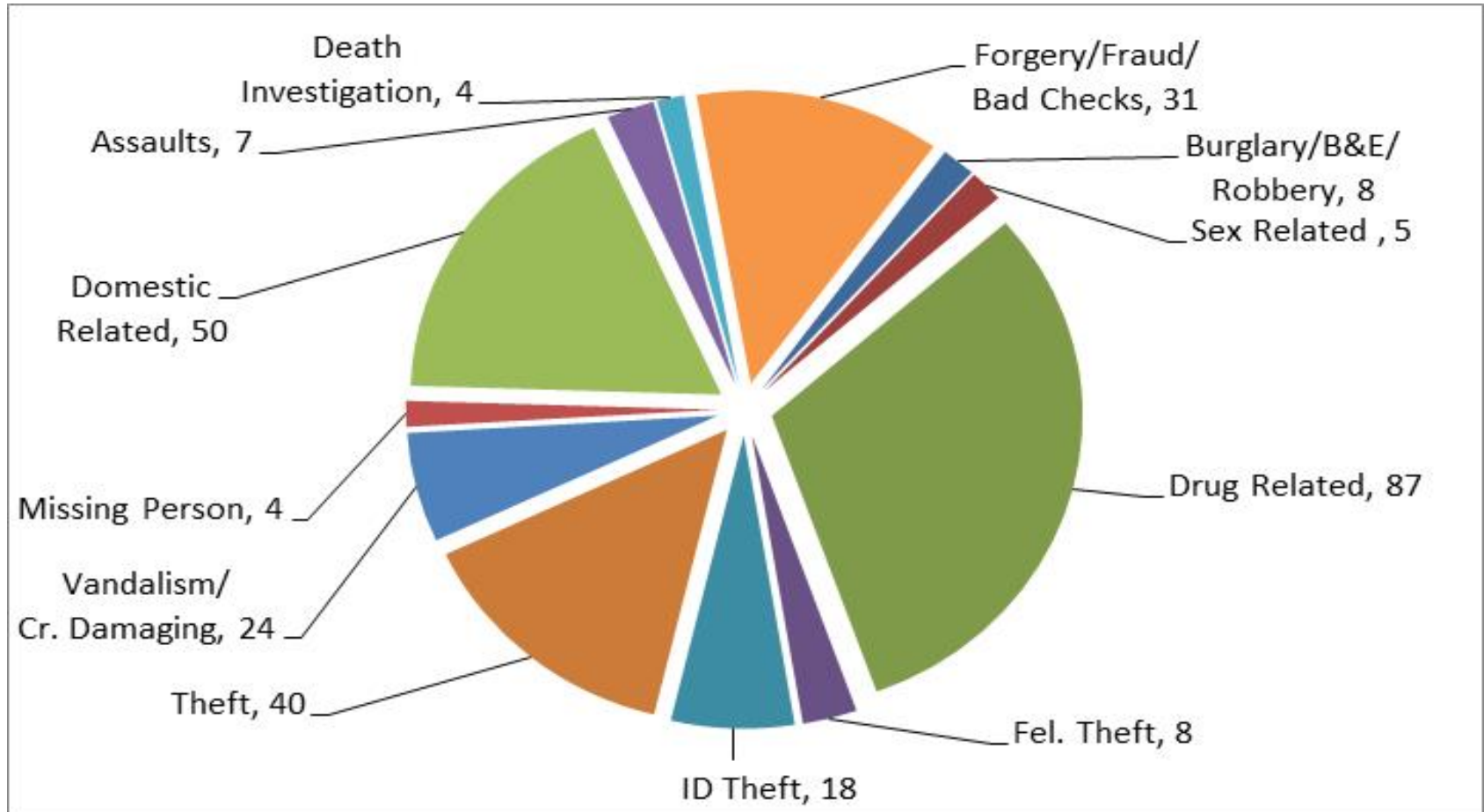
Ohio Collaborative Certification

- ▶ In Spring of 2016, the department began an effort to voluntarily gain acceptance into the “*Ohio Collaborative Law Enforcement Agency Certification Standard*” given by the Office of Criminal Justice Services.
- ▶ On Dec. 28th, after some arduous work, BPD joined a select group of agencies in Ohio to meet this standard. Lt. Carmin was the driving force behind this successful endeavor – we are very proud of this accomplishment!

 - Participate in joint training activities with STPD

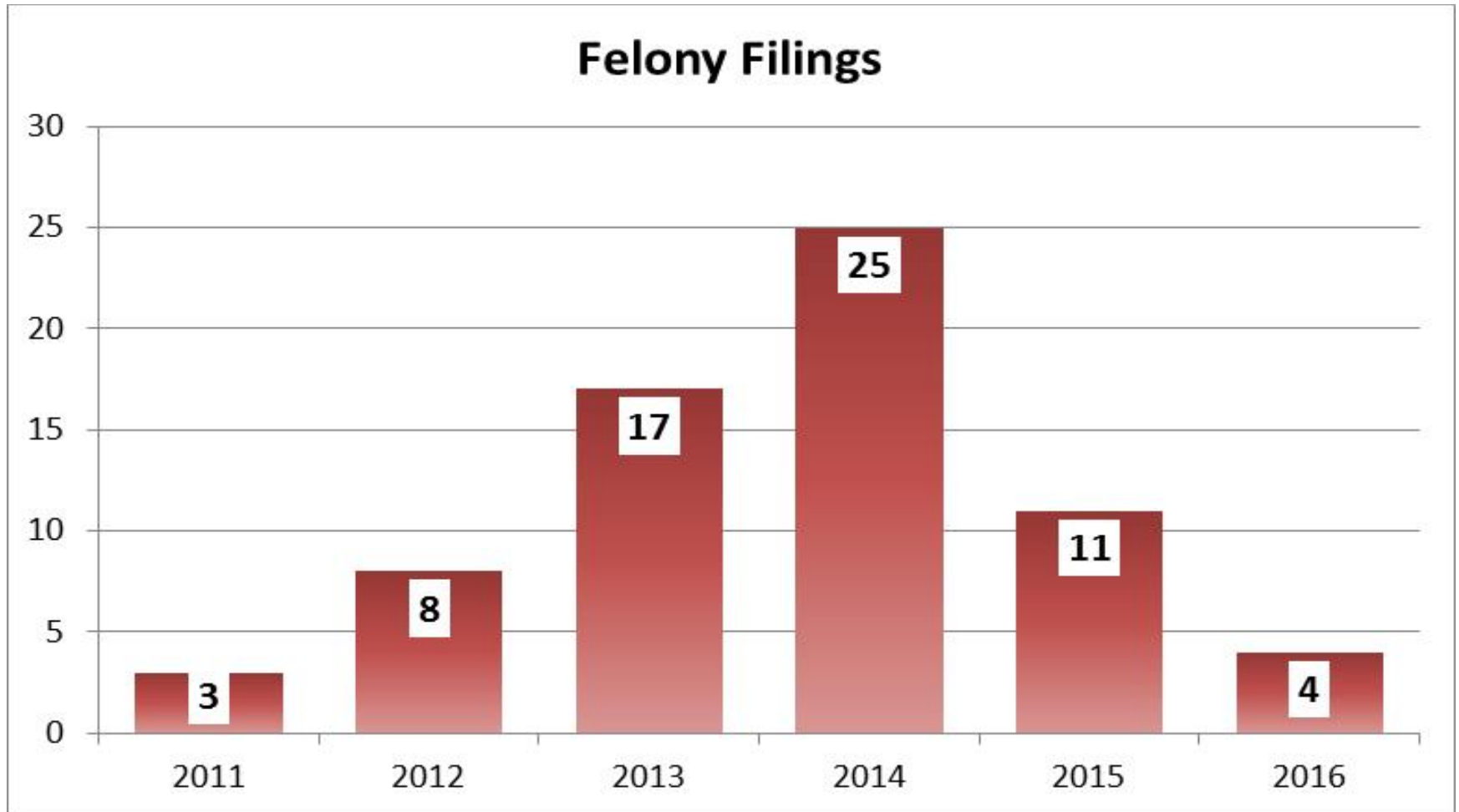

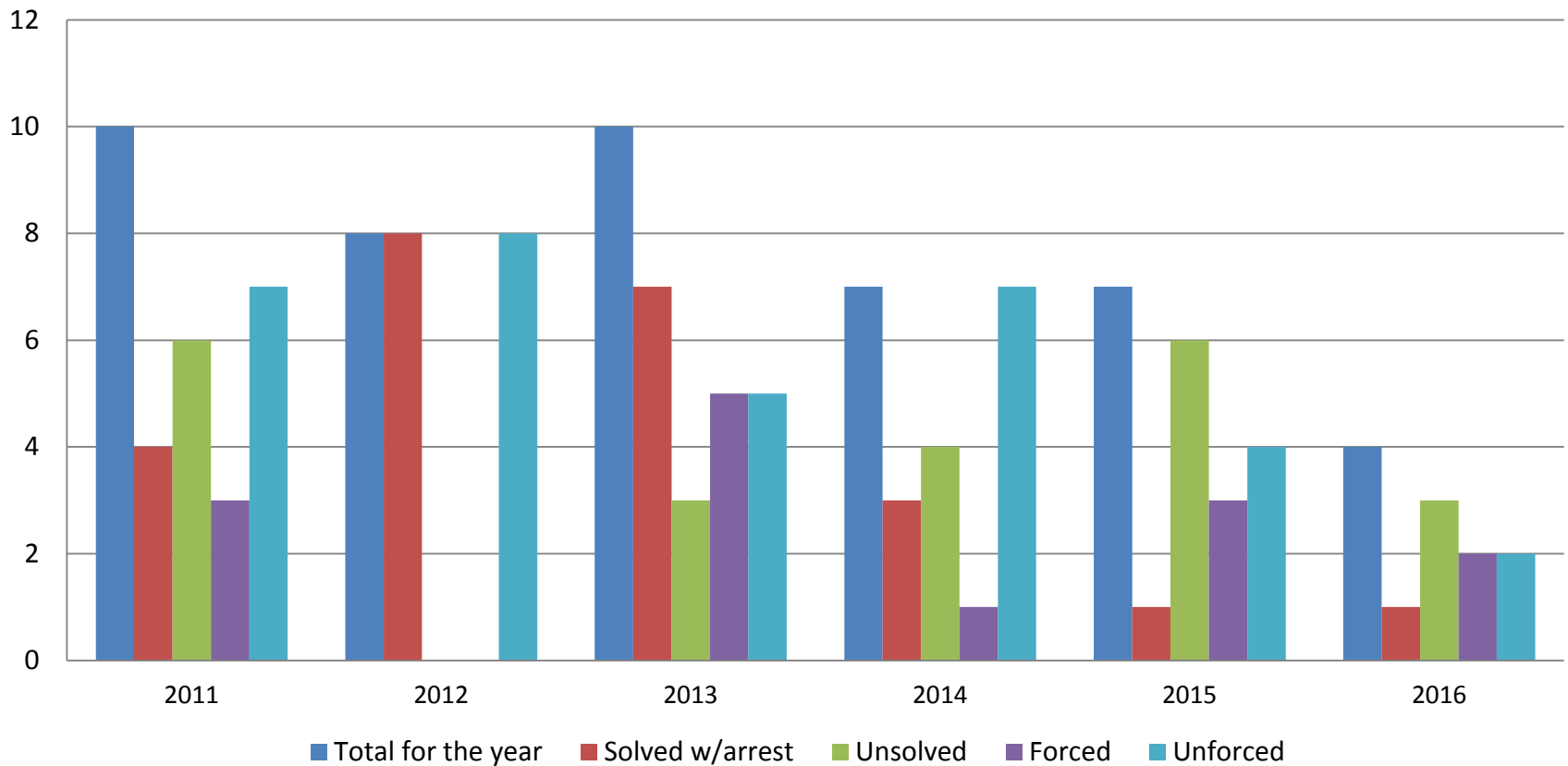

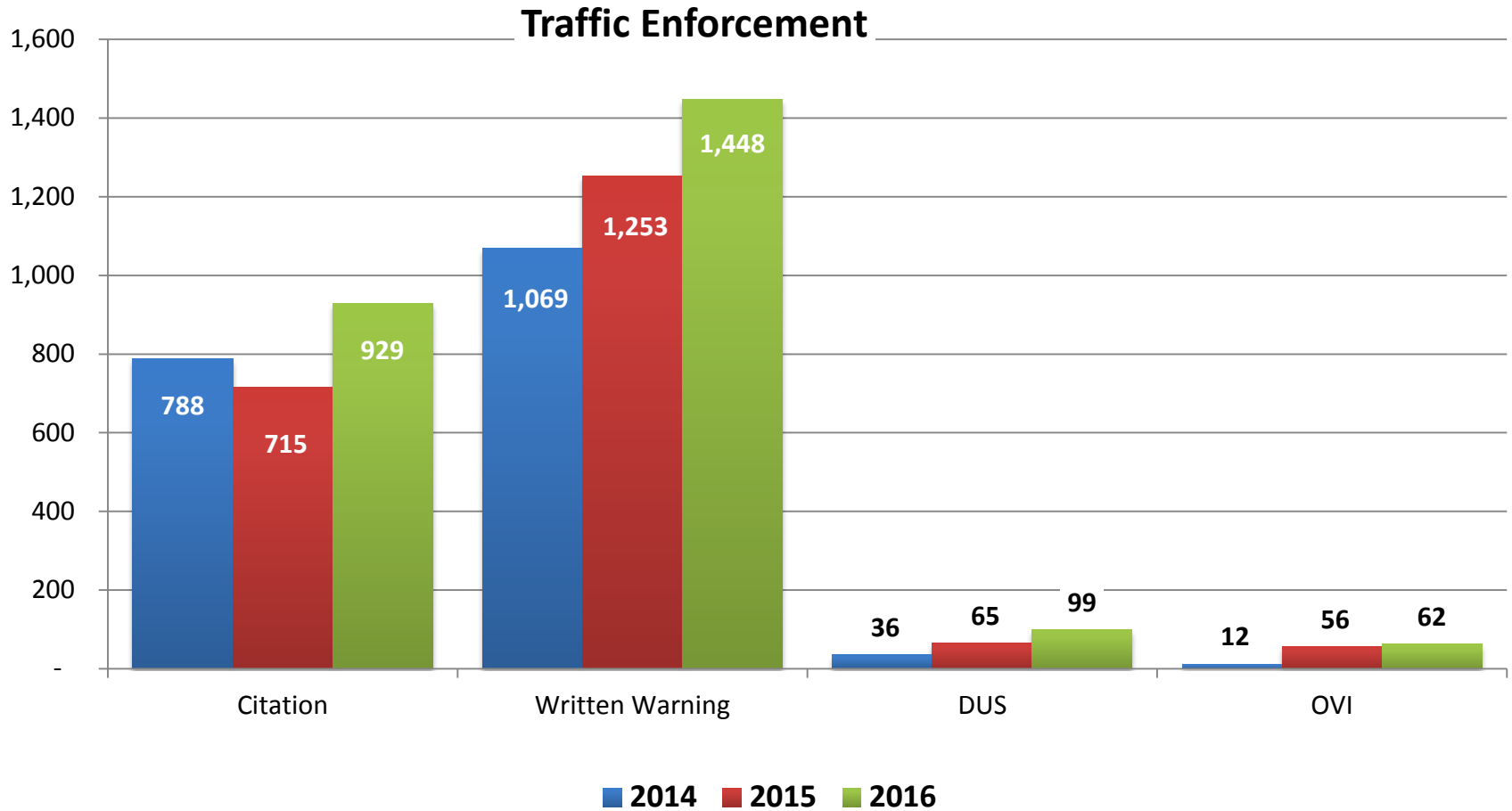

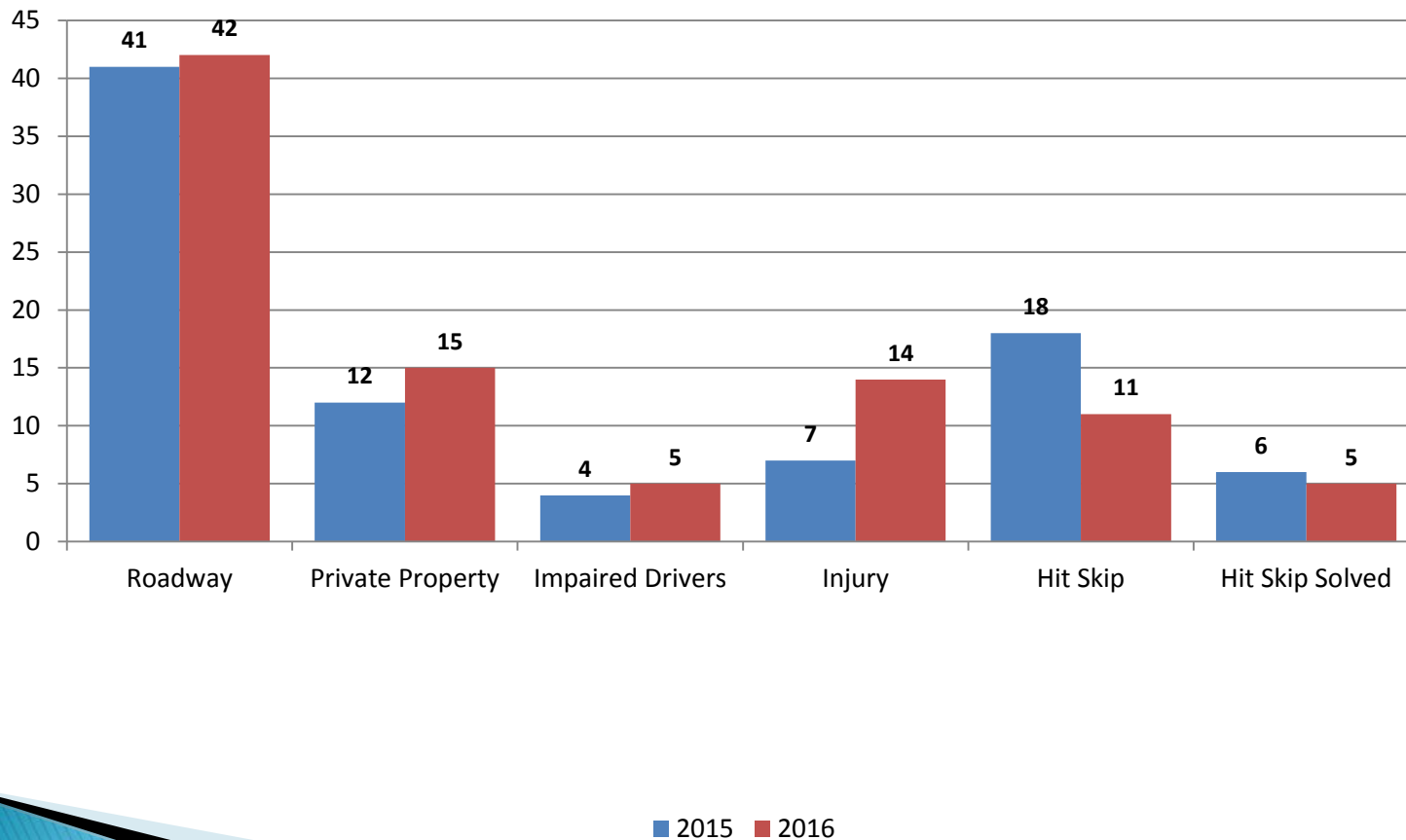

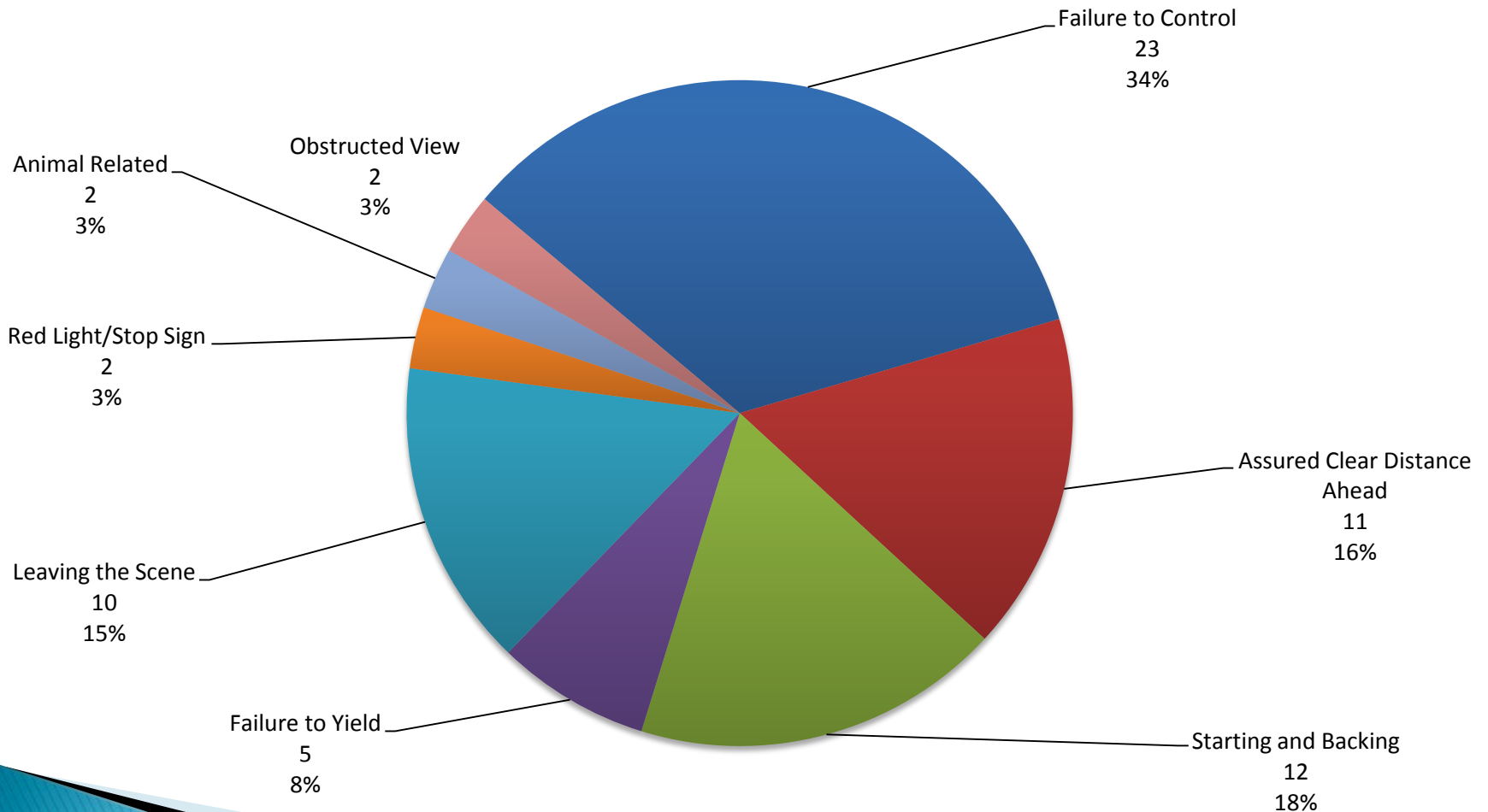
Traffic Accidents

Officer Training

- ▶ Each year, our officers receive many hours of training. While some training is conducted in house, other training is taken outside the department. The Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission required all officers in the State of Ohio to complete 11 Continuing Professional Training hours in 2016 (up 7 hours from 2015). Besides required in house training and state requirements through CPT hours, officers attend outside trainings to build upon their knowledge to become better officers.
- ▶ Bellbrook Police Officers were also trained in 2016 outside the department by training officers to help meet the CPT requirements. Other outside trainings were to better the individual officer which would also benefit the whole agency.

Use of Force Analysis

- ▶ Bellbrook Police officers enforce state law and city ordinances. While doing so, from time to time, it is necessary for officers to use reasonable force to gain control of a person or situation. This could range from hands on physical force to deadly force. In 2016, Bellbrook officers used force three (3) times. Each Use of Force is reviewed by the Shift Sergeant and Lieutenant to make sure each instance is justified. All three (3) were found to be justified. The following shows what force was used:

Bicycle Patrol

- ▶ In 2016, the Bike Patrol Unit expanded its reach in the community. We had our two part-time officers join the Bike Patrol Unit which only consisted of Patrolman Mark Burns. Both part-time officers received the necessary bike training from other employers which saved the City of Bellbrook training cost.
- ▶ The Bike Patrol made a major jump in hours this year with a total of 148 hours. In 2015, this was only 33 hours. Bellbrook residents have been receptive of this program. The Bike Patrol Unit and its operation are supervised by Sgt. Meade.
